

marital asset. The horse shall be listed for sale within 30 days, and the parties shall agree upon a broker for such sale, or in the alternative, the attorneys for the parties shall each provide two names of qualified brokers, and shall thereafter select a single broker from among them.

The parties shall equally divide any proceeds from the sale of the horse. In the event that the animal is in such poor physical condition that it cannot be sold, then it shall be "put down".

C. Vehicles: The Wife shall have sole use, ownership, and possession of the Jeep Liberty; the Husband shall have sole use, ownership, and possession of the Chrysler mini-van; each party shall assume sole liability for all expenses and liabilities associated with his or her respective vehicle.

D. The Husband shall receive his U.S. Air stock, valued at approximately \$50.00, free from any claim by the Wife.

E. The Husband shall receive the beer stein collection (valued at approximately \$500.00) and the "wood spirit" collection (valued at approximately \$1,500.00) free from any claim by the Wife.

F. The Bryer Horses collection, valued at approximately \$12,000.00, shall be equally divided between the parties.

G. The artwork accumulated by the parties during the marriage and valued at approximately \$15,000.00, shall be equally divided between the parties.

H. The computers, peripherals, and other electronics acquired by the parties prior to the filing date (valued at approximately \$3,200.00) shall be equally divided between the parties.

I. The Husband shall receive the "Christmas Village" collection (valued at approximately \$1,500.00) free from any claim by the Wife.

J. Any furniture or furnishings in the marital home existing at the date of filing shall be equally divided between the parties. Testimony has established that the Wife has previously received a substantial portion of the same. The Wife's share of any remaining furniture or furnishings shall be claimed by the wife in a timely manner, or in the alternative, shall be deemed to be the property of the Husband to do with or dispose of at his sole discretion.

K. None of the foregoing provisions shall preclude the parties from negotiating a "buy-out" of their respective interest in the assets/liabilities listed above between themselves.

5. Alimony: Neither party shall be entitled to receive nor obligated to pay alimony to the other party. Pursuant to Section 61.08, Florida Statutes, the court finds as follows:

A. The parties did not enjoy a "lavish" lifestyle. Much of their marital earnings were
